Chenoa Water Updates Bev Pickett, Water Commissioner

The Clear Well project has been completed and should be in service the week of 1/8. Our old Well was 50-60 years old and below ground. This one is above ground and helps to keep the pumps not to work to hard.

Phase 1 of the water main should begin spring of 2025. This will include 8800 feet of new main, hydrants and valves.

We would appreciate anyone who has lead in the water pipes to make sure City Hall is aware.

This is crucial so we can complete our report by 4-1-24. This inventory needs to be completed so we can turn that into the EPA. A year from that we have to have a plan in place on replacing all lead in our inventory. We do appreciate any suggestions that could help out in this process. As a reminder, unforturnatly any improvements will come with a cost. So at some point we will have to raise our water rate.

Did you know about the water app that you can download to your phone to monitor your water usage? It is called Eyeonwater and it is free to download. You just need to know your billing account number to use it. You can monitor if you have leaks with this. It will show you in graphs on per day, week, month or year on when the most water is being used. I personally like keeping track of the usage this way and helps with reminding me why 1 day is much higher than average, for example you hosted a family dinner. Or you find out the who is using the most water in the house! And it wasn't me!!!
